

KDHE Retail Partnership with Dillons and Dollar General – Fact Sheet/FAQ

Why is the Kansas Department of Health & Environment (KDHE) launching an incentives program?

To encourage vaccinations and mitigate the spread of COVID-19, Governor Laura Kelly, Dillons Health, and Dollar General have launched a new vaccine incentive program.

Who is eligible to receive the \$50 Visa gift card per dose?

All newly vaccinated Kansans, at the participating locations, aged 12+ are eligible for the \$50 Visa gift card per dose, \$100 total. Kansans who have already received either dose of the vaccine are not eligible to retroactively apply for the incentive at this time.

Will the gift card be available at all vaccine sites?

The \$50 gift card is currently only available at select Dillons and Dollar General locations.

How long will the program run for?

Gift cards will be provided on a first-come first-serve basis and the program will run for as long as supplies last.

Why are there limited supplies?

The current funding from the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention is only sufficient to vaccinate ~8000 Kansans. The Kansas Department of Health & Environment hopes to expand the program in the future if additional funding becomes available.

What's the process to request the gift card?

Kansans who receive their vaccination at a participating Dillons or Dollar General location, will be given a form and a pre-stamped envelope at the time of their vaccination. Once they fill out and mail the form to KDHE, a \$50 Visa gift card will be mailed to the mailing address provided in the form, while gift card supplies last.

What happens after I send in my paperwork? How long before I receive the gift card?

Kansans should expect to receive the card at their specified address within 7-10 day of KDHE receiving the properly completed request form.

Is KDHE verifying that the vaccine was administered at one of the designated locations?

Yes, we are verifying vaccine location.

Do Kansans need to pay for the vaccines?

COVID-19 vaccines are provided at no cost to the vaccine recipient at all locations. Dillons locations will ask

recipient to present insurance cards if available for administrative purposes. However, whether recipients have insurance or not the vaccine will still be provided at no cost.
