	<i>Booster doses can be mix and match - you may receive any of the three vaccines for your booster</i>			
Booster dose <i>Refers to dose given to increase immunity against mild and moderate COVID-19 infections</i>	Those 18 and older who received Pfizer or Moderna primary series	 6 months after primary	 6 months after primary	 6 months after primary
	Those 18 and older who received J&J primary series	 2 months after primary	 2 months after primary	 2 months after primary
	Those 18 and older who are moderately and severely immunocompromised	 6 months after additional	 6 months after additional	 2 months after primary

Note: You may receive flu or any other vaccines at the same time as a COVID-19 vaccine

*Children ages 5 to 11 require a pediatric dose of the Pfizer vaccine
