
















# COVID-19 Vaccine eligibility information for Primary, Additional, and Booster vaccines

The chart below contains information on who is eligible for which COVID-19 vaccine:

<b>Primary series</b> <i>Refers to vaccinations needed to be considered fully vaccinated</i>	<b>Ages 5-17</b> <i>(Note: Children ages 5 to 11 require a pediatric dose of the Pfizer vaccine)</i>	 21 days apart	Not yet authorized	Not yet authorized
	<b>Ages 18 and older</b>	 21 days apart	 28 days apart	
<b>Additional dose</b> <i>Some groups require three doses to be fully vaccinated</i>  <i>Note: Booster doses may be given after additional dose</i>	<i>Additional doses should be the <b>same vaccine type as primary series</b> if available</i>			
	Those moderately and severely immunocompromised who are 5 & older and received mRNA primary series (Pfizer or Moderna) <i>(Note: Pfizer is the only authorized additional dose for adolescents aged 5-17)</i>	 28 days after primary	 28 days after primary	Not authorized
<b>Booster dose</b> <i>Refers to dose needed to be up to date with COVID-19 vaccination</i>	<i>Booster doses can be <b>mix and match</b> - you may receive <b>any of the approved vaccines</b> as your booster</i>			
	Ages 12 & older who received mRNA primary series or additional dose (Pfizer or Moderna) <i>(Note: Pfizer is the only authorized booster for adolescents aged 12-17)</i>	 5 months after primary or additional	 5 months after primary or additional	 5 months after primary or additional
	Ages 18 & older who received J&J primary series	 2 months after primary	 2 months after primary	 2 months after primary
